SEARCH WARRANT

Proof by affidavit having been made this day before me by Special Agent Robert Mancene, shield #2829, of the Department of Homeland Security-Homeland Security Investigations (DHS-HSI), that there is reasonable cause to believe that certain property, to wit:

a. A headless bronze statue of the Roman emperor Marcus Aurelius (“**Marcus Aurelius**”), dated ca. 180-200 C.E., measuring 76 inches tall, and valued at \$20,000,000. *See* Exhibit 1 (Photograph of **Marcus Aurelius**).


May be found at the Cleveland Museum of Art, 11150 East Boulevard, Cleveland, Ohio 44106 (**THE TARGET PREMISES**) and that the above-described object is stolen and constitutes evidence of, and tends to demonstrate the commission of the crimes of, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property in the First Degree, Penal Law § 165.54, and a Conspiracy to commit the same crime under Penal Law § 105.10(1).

YOU ARE THEREFORE COMMANDED, between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m., to seize the above-described property, and bring it before the Court without unnecessary delay.

FURTHER, given a) the professional assistance required to transport such a delicate antiquity, and b) the Cleveland Museum’s agreement to maintain the piece until the warrant’s execution, this warrant be deemed executed upon service.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the affidavit is sealed, except that the affidavit may be disclosed by an Assistant District Attorney in the New York County District Attorney’s Office in the course of the lawful discharge of his or her duties pursuant to a criminal investigation and/or prosecution, or upon written order of the Court.

This warrant must be executed within 10 days of the date of issuance.
